Goals for the Department

Continuous

- Provide supportive, inclusive opportunities and services for students with disabilities.
- Advocate for continued support for students with disabilities at the local and state level

Short Term

- By Spring 2022, improve Math & Literacy pass rate by 6%.
 - 2020-21 Math SWD SOL Pass Rate was 19% (state average 31%).
 - 2020-21 Reading SWD SOL Pass Rate was 34% (state average 40%).

Long Term

- By 2024, increase capacity from serving 18 students up to 30 students who require intensive social, emotional and behavioral instruction and supports
- By 2024, increase students served in CCS public school setting from 90 to 95%.
