Title I, Part A, Improving Basic Programs Stacy Reedal

- The goal of the Title I, Part A, grant is to provide all children significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps.
- The allocation of funds is based primarily on low-income data.
- The primary focus for CCS is on literacy, math, and family engagement. We use Title I, Part A to support these areas through school-wide programs

Title II, Part A, Supporting Effective Instruction Maria Lewis

- Funds are made available to improve teaching and student learning in the core subject areas. Activities can provide sustained and intensive high-quality professional development that can help students achieve high academic standards.
- Other uses include reducing class size by using funds for teacher salaries and professional development for teachers focusing on differentiated instruction, content knowledge, critical thinking, and pedagogy.

Title III, Part A, Language Instruction for English Learners and Immigrant Students Dr. Jeannie Pfautz

- Title IIIA services include improving instruction for students who are building their proficiency in English by identifying and upgrading curricula and supplementing instructional materials.
- Other potential uses include providing additional tutoring services, professional development opportunities for teachers, and family engagement events for multilingual families.
- Immigrant and Youth funding provides support for students within their first three years of public school in the United States.
