Cell Phone Policy

Off & Away the Entire Day

 Clarity and consistency: The school will follow last year's guidance and protocols.

Virginia State Guidance

 We expect to be in compliance with pending state guidelines (draft to be released in Sept).

Communicating the Why

• Less time on phones & social media improves mental health, learning, and relationships.

Supporting with Communication

• We will focus on procedures for when families need to contact the office or their student.

Exterior Door Access Control:

From the inside: If doors are opened or propped without a fob, an area alarm sounds and an alert goes to CSAs and admin.

From the outside: Doors remain locked except to those with fob access.

Installation nearly complete.

Weapons Detectors for Public, Ticketed Events

- Ceia Opengate detectors will be used at public, ticketed events when expected participation is 250 or more
- Clear bags at all ticketed events
- Staff training underway
- Signage and communication underway

Improved Visitor Management System: Securly

- Used at some elementary schools in 2023-24; will be used at all Cville Schools this year
- The prior system utilized mechanical scanners which were obsolete and expensive to maintain
- Securly also integrates with E-Hall Passes

First Restroom Renovations Underway (B Commons)

All Gender, Single-Stall Toilets with Sinks in Public View

Why?

- Better privacy
- Better accountability

Construction Update

This first project is currently underway and may be finalized during open house events.

Future Plans

- Replicate this model throughout CHS
- This model is in place at the future Charlottesville Middle School

E-Hall Pass System

Better for Students

- Easier and faster to receive passes
- Passes can be pre-scheduled for appointments
- Helps keep students
 accountable for the
 frequency and
 duration of their hall
 excursions

Easy Use for Staff

- Easier and faster to issue passes
- In emergencies, it provides a list of students not in class
- System automatically limits the number of passes issued for a location and/or time

A Proven System
