Priority 1: Increase Academic Achievement

- Goal 3: All CCS learners will demonstrate mastery in reading and math, leading to the elimination of achievement and opportunity gaps.
 - Target 5: 80% or more students will demonstrate mastery and proficiency in tier 1 instruction
 - Target 9: Increase reading achievement for all students to at least 75% proficiency across all student membership groups
 - Target 10: Increase math achievement for all students to at least 70% proficiency across all student membership groups
 - Target 11: Annually reduce failure of math and reading SOLs by 10% or more for AfricanAmerican students and students with disabilities

What is ALL IN?

- Attendance, Literacy, Learning
- A way to combat learning loss from the pandemic
- Funds provided to VA school divisions to provide tutoring (70%), support literacy (20%), and combat chronic absenteeism (10%)
- CCS will receive \$946,637

Literacy

- Virginia Literacy Act (VLA) passed in the 2022
 General Assembly
- Goal to improve early literacy outcomes for students
- VDOE support tools, resources, technical assistance and funding.
- Reading Specialists to take a VDOE Canvas course

Learning (Guiding Principles)

- High Intensity, high dosage tutoring
- Low teacher/student ratio (ex: 1:10)
- Grade level materials
- Digital Platforms from VDOE
- Trained and supported tutors
- Relationships
- Progress monitoring

Who are the students?

- Students in 3rd-8th grade
 - At risk (scored in the low proficient range on their grade 3-7 reading and/or mathematic assessment)
 - Not proficient (did not pass the reading and / or math SOL)
 - Including SWD and ELLs

Student Placement for Grade 3:

Students are given the Virginia Growth Assessment (VGA) in the fall and winter in both reading and mathematics annually. Students in grade 3 are required to be placed in tutoring based on their scores on the fall administration of the VGA in reading and mathematics.

The VGA scores for students that require tutoring for students in grade 3 are:

^{*}The VGA does not provide achievement levels based on student performance; instead, the FALL VGA provides academic data on where a student should be at the entry of the third-grade school year.

Student Placement for Grades 4-8:

Students are annually evaluated through the Standards of Assessment (SOL) assessment at the end of each academic year. Any student in grades 4-8 who is "not proficient" or "at risk" on their previous year's Reading SOL must receive reading tutoring. Any student in grades 4-8 who is "not proficient" or "at risk" on their previous year's Mathematic SOL must receive mathematic tutoring.

The SOL scores for students that require tutoring in grades 4-8 for 2023-24 are:

^{*}Note that the grade level represents the previous year's score. For example, the grade 3 SOL score will be used to determine if a current grade 4 student is required to receive tutoring.
