

# EMERGENCY SCHOOL BOARD MEETING (COVID-19) CHARLOTTESVILLE CITY SCHOOLS Electronic/Zoom Virtual Meeting Thursday, February 4, 2021 (5:00 PM)

**1.1** <u>Call to Order:</u> School Board Chair Lisa Torres called the emergency electronic/Zoom meeting to order at 5:01p.m. Ms. Lisa Torres noted that this emergency electronic meeting was held in accordance with the Virginia Freedom of Information Act §2.2- 3708.2 (A) (3), as amended, for the purpose of addressing matters related to the response to the State of Emergency and the Governor's announcement that all public schools remain closed for the rest of the 2020-21 academic year. **4.1** <u>Approval of Proposed Agenda</u>: Dr. Kraft made a motion, seconded by Ms Puryear, to approve the proposed agenda. Upon a roll-call vote being taken, the motion carried with Mr. Bryant, Ms. Bryson Morsberger, Dr. Kraft, Ms. McKeever, Ms. Puryear, Ms. Torres, Mr. Wade voting yes. 7 ayes, 0 nays.

# 5.1 Comments from Members of the Community:

- Ann Marie Smith shared concerns related to students still receiving virtual instruction.
- Jenn Maeng shared concerns on the upcoming calendar 2021-22.
- Deborah Hellman shared thoughts on having students back face to face.
- Annie Suttle shared information on the PTO Joint Reopening Fund

- Sana Syed shared thoughts on getting all the students back face to face.
- John Wells shared concerns on bringing PreK to 2nd grade back face to face and not having 3rd and 4th grade.
- Emily Wong gave input on having students back face to face.
- Jennifer Grover shared concerns that some students split up from their current classes with the new reopening plan. Asked staff to reconsider the format.
- Richard Feero thanked the community for coming out to show support on having the students back face to face.

#### **Student and Staff Recognitions**

They deserve all the recognition and praise we can give them.

**6.2** <u>National School Counseling Week</u>: Dr. Kendra King, Director of Student Services and Achievement, invited the Board and all those present to recognize National School Counselor Appreciation Week as February 1-5, 2021. This week is also recognized by the Virginia Department of Education. School Counselors will be recognized for the many services they provide to students, teachers, parents, and administrators by the Charlottesville City Schools' administration and School Board. **6.3** <u>Virginia School Boards Association School Board Appreciation Month</u>: The month of February has been designated by the Virginia School Boards Association and proclaimed by Governor Ralph Northam as School Board Appreciation Month. Dr. King presented a copy of the Governor's Proclamation.

**6.4** <u>Virginia School Boards Association School Board Clerk and Deputy Clerk Appreciation Week</u>: Dr. Kendra King, Director of Student Services and Achievement, stated that the VSBA Board of Directors has designated the third week in February as "VSBA School Board Clerk Appreciation Week." The VSBA encourages all school boards to adopt the presented proclamation. Appreciation was expressed to Leslie Thacker, Deputy Clerk, and Julia Green, Clerk.

**7.1-3** <u>Adoption of Consent Agenda</u>: Items from the consent agenda included: <u>Personnel Recommendations</u> and <u>Business, Financial, Routine Reports</u>. Ms. Puryear made a motion, seconded by Mr. Bryant, to approve the adoption of the consent agenda. Upon a roll-call vote being taken, the motion carried with Mr. Bryant, Ms. Bryson Morsberger, Dr. Kraft, Ms. McKeever, Ms. Puryear, Ms. Torres, and Mr. Wade voting yes. 7 ayes, 0 nays.

#### **Action Items**

**8.1** <u>Affirming Return to In-Person Instruction - Option A - March 8, 2021</u>: Dr. Rosa Atkins, Division Superintendent, recommended that the Board affirm their January 7, 2021 vote to resume in person learning beginning March 8 following Option A, which provides in-person instruction to students in PreK-grade 2 (if their

families selected it). In addition, Option A also brings back targeted students in grades 3-12 so that they can receive the face-to-face supports they need.

Earlier this year, Dr. Atkins convened a COVID-19 Advisory Committee including teachers and staff, students and families, community members, medical professionals, and other community stakeholders. The committee made its initial proposal at the December 17, 2021 meeting including revised models for Board consideration. At the January 7, 2021 meeting, the Board postponed implementation until March 8, pending a review of data in February.

- Ms. McKeever objected to Option A stating that she would like to see students more broadly transitioned back to school as soon as possible. She would like to see every student in PK-12 have the opportunity to return to school in some form and isn't in support of extending the school year.
- Ms. Bryson Morseberger objected to Option A and noted that she doesn't want to open schools until staff has received their second vaccination and are fully immunized. She added that there is no vaccine for children and the long term effects on children are currently unknown.
- Mr. Wade, Mr. Bryant, and Dr. Kraft spoke in support of moving ahead with Option A.
- Dr. Atkins provided an update on teacher and staff vaccination efforts and noted that the proposed March 8 start is a starting point in the process of getting students back into the buildings.
- Ms. Powell noted that the Virginia Department of Health has given reassurance that those given the first vaccination will receive the second one in the targeted time span.
- Ms. Bryson Morseberger spoke on the need for teacher training, masks, social distancing, and PPE. Dr. Atkins responded with details on mitigation efforts and supplies.
- Dr. Kraft noted that she would like to see the Board provide guidance but not get into the weeds on every aspect of opening.
- Ms. McKeever spoke in favor of beginning face to face learning on March 8 for PK-4 and the following week Walker and Buford students (all students who want to come) return.
- Ms. Torres noted that transportation is a known issue and planning has been based on the number of students who completed the survey and indicated that they would like to return.

Ms. McKeever made a motion to amend proposed Option A begins on March 8 and includes PK-4 (instead of PK-2). There was no second and the motion failed.

Mr. Wade made a motion to approve Option A for bringing PK-2 students back to school on March 8, 2021 with latitude from principals and teachers within the building to bring in 3rd and 4th graders with proper notice and when they feel it is safe to do so, Dr. Kraft seconded the motion. Mr. Bryant, Dr. Kraft, Ms. McKeever, Ms. Puryear, Ms. Torres, and Mr. Wade voting yes. 6 ayes, 1 nay. Ms. Bryson Morsberger voted no.

**9.1** <u>Antiracist/Anti-bias Social Studies Education</u>: Dr. Katina Otey, Chief Academic Officer, introduced Neeley Minton, Coordinator of Social Studies and World Languages, who presented an update on Antiracist/Anti-bias Social Studies Education in Charlottesville City Schools.

April Brown, 5th Grade ELA/Virginia Studies teacher at Walker, and Rachel Caldwell, 3rd Grade Teacher at Venable presented information on a Model Policies for the Treatment of Transgender Students in Virginia's Public Schools.

• Board members expressed appreciation for all the effort going on to address this important work.

**9.2** Jefferson School African American Heritage Center - "Embracing Our Narratives" Project Update: Dr. Katina Otey, Chief Academic Officer, introduced Dr. Andrea Douglas, Executive Director of the Jefferson School African American Heritage Center, and Dr. Kimalee Dickerson, Project Manager, who presented an update on Jefferson School African American Heritage Center seminar "Embracing Our Narratives".

**9.3** <u>2021-2022 School Calendar</u>: Dr. Katina Otey, Chief Academic Officer, presented the 2021-2022 School Calendar for Board information. Annually, the Charlottesville City School Board is charged with the development and approval of a calendar which must incorporate 180 days or 990 hours of instruction for students served in the school division. A draft of the 2021-2022 school calendar was posted on our website for review and comment. All comments received were taken into consideration when developing the proposed calendar. A copy of the proposed calendar was presented for Board review.</u>

• Dr. Otey answered questions from the Board regarding the January 3, 2022 holiday.
