Setting the Stage 2021-2022 School Calendar

- What we know
 - Face-to-face (in-person) instruction will occur five days a week for a full instructional day
 - ▶ We will follow the approved 2021-2022 CCS calendar
 - There is a requirement of 180 days / 990 hours
 - Virtual Virginia (VVA) will be available for K-12 students
 - CCS Virtual Learning may be an option for select students





Legislation

- General assembly bill
 - SB 1303
 - School divisions **must** offer in-person instruction to each student enrolled in the local school division
 - School divisions may offer virtual instruction
 - If virtual instruction is offered, students who are not successful with this modality will transition back to in-person learning
- Governor signed this bill on 3/31/2021



Considerations for virtual instruction

- Amount of synchronous time that would occur in virtual learning
- Amount of screen time students would have
- Asynchronous learning will not count towards 990 hours in 2021-2022
- Possible application process for virtual learning
- Virtual Virginia (VVA) versus CCS virtual learning



Next steps

- Continue with planning for fall 2021
 - Remain up-to-date with legislature and Governor's mandates
 - Monitor CDC and VDOE guidelines
