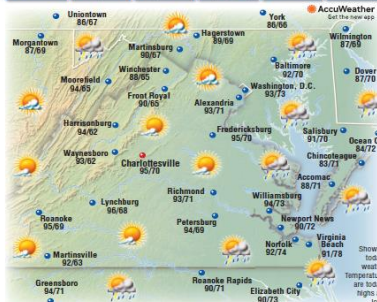

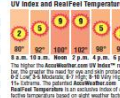

Mims leaving Virginia high court in spring

RICHMOND — Supreme Court of Virginia Justice William C. Mims, a former state delegate, senator and Virginia attorney general, will seek reappointment when his current term on the high court expires March 31.

In a letter to Gov. Ralph Northam, House Speaker Elbert Hubbard and Senate Majority Leader Dick Saslaw, Mims wrote that he was providing ample notice so those wishing to be considered for the court can advance their candidacies. The General Assembly will take up the upcoming vacancy when it reconvenes in January.

"Serving the people of the commonwealth for a 12-year term on the court, and 30 years overall, has been an honor beyond measure," he wrote. "I have been blessed within meaningful work and valued colleagues. Now as I approach

65th birthday in June 2022, the time has come to discern other opportunities to serve."

In an email to the Richmond Times-Dispatch on Thursday, Mims wrote: "Retired judges have

been honored to serve on the court for one-third of my legal career and I am grateful for the trust that has been placed in me."

Mims said he does not yet have any specific plans but has an interest in teaching. He said he has been an adjunct professor at the George Mason University School of Law, now the Antonin Scalia Law School, and the Appalachian School of Law, as well as a guest lecturer to undergraduate and law school classes.

He added that he will be at Christopher Newport University regularly this fall at the invitation of the Watson Center for Civic Leadership.

If eligible, he said he would appreciate continuing to serve on the Supreme Court as a senior justice who would be voted upon each year by the court. There is a maximum of five senior justices on the court and there are currently three.

Not all retired justices are eligible. Affiliation with a law firm or holding a position involving fundraising are among the things that can rule out eligibility, he said.

In April 2010, Mims was sworn in as Virginia's chief justice and only the second one to have previously served in the General Assembly and as Virginia's attorney general.

Mims represented Loudoun County in the House and the Senate before leaving the legislature in 2006 to become deputy attorney general under then-Attorney General Rob McDonnell.

When McDonnell resigned in 2009 to run for governor, Mims was selected by the GOP-controlled House and the Democratic-dominated Senate to complete McDonnell's term as the state's chief legal officer. He succeeded Barbara M. Keenan on the high court after she left to serve on a federal appeals court.

Rovlin said police suspect the same perpetrator or perpetrators are behind the recent thefts.

"They've been hitting a bunch of vehicles all in the same night. It's not an everyday occurrence," he said.

Rovlin said drivers should park in well-lit areas with cameras and near busy roadways to help deter thefts. Additionally, shields and other devices designed to be installed over catalytic converters can help offset thefts, he said.

"We really need a lot of help from the public on this one. We need them to be on the lookout for anything suspicious," Rovlin said. "We think that if they're using saw blades to cut these converters off, and when those blades hit the metal, it makes a loud noise."

Albemarle County also has seen an increase in catalytic converter theft, according to Abbey Stamp, spokesperson for the county police.

So far in 2021, Stamp said



Catalytic converters are attractive to thieves because they often are composed of three valuable metals: platinum, palladium and rhodium.

There have been 77 cases involving at least one catalytic converter theft or attempted theft. This compares with 18 cases for the same period last year, she said.

"Albemarle community to remain alert and follow-up on tips to better protect personal property," she said. "Basic preventative measures can help deter a variety of vehicle-related thefts — whether it be a catalytic converter, bags and personal property inside the car, tires, or the entire car itself."

Raw sewage leaks into the James River

Swimming advisory issued in Richmond

People and pets should avoid swimming, wading and tubing in the James River in Richmond, says the Virginia Department of Health.

The water advisory applies to "all of Tuckahoe Creek" beginning at River Road, including the 300,000 gallons poured into Tuckahoe Creek, which feeds into the James River.

Goodland County estimates that "900,000 gallons of raw, undiluted sewage" was released following a 4-to-6-inch rupture around 7:30 p.m. Tuesday that flowed into the James River.

There is no impact on drinking water at this time, VDH said. An end date for the advisory hasn't yet been determined, but it will be based on bacteria levels in the water, VDH said.

VDH said activities not likely to result in water submersion (boating, fishing, canoeing) may continue with proper caution.

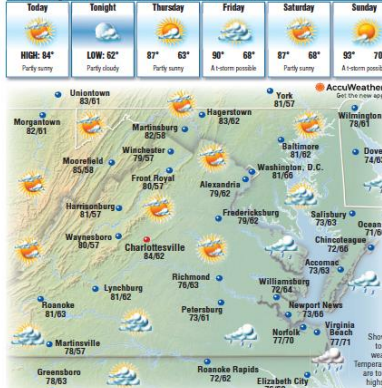

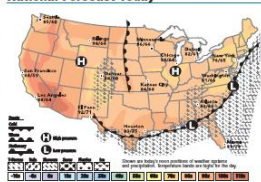
